First author and corresponding author will get full marks in a publication and rest of the authors will get 75% mark*). First page of the published article should be submitted as proof.

- **3.2.** Books/ Book Chapters/ Policy Papers- (2.0 marks for each authored book, and 1.0 mark for each edited book from reputed publisher along with copyright/ISBN no.; 0.50 mark for each book chapter/policy paper subjected to maximum of 3 marks out of 6 marks allotted for this section) First author will get full marks and rest of the authors will get 75% mark: Maximum 6 marks
- **3.**3 Leaflets/ popular articles/ technical articles/lead papers/invited papers (0.5 marks for each publication) First author will get full marks and rest of the authors will get 75% mark: Maximum 3 marks
- **3.4** Bulletins/ Monographs; *First author will get full marks and rest of the authors will get 75% mark (1.0 mark for each)*: **Maximum 6 marks**

These include integrated farming system models, characterization and conservation methodologies, institutional innovations and innovative extension efforts. Candidates should enclose documentary proof of the wide adoption of products and technologies at least at regional scale (1.0 mark for each effort) Main developer will get full marks and rest of the co-developer will get 75% mark: Maximum 5 marks
